Annual Progress Report 2023-2024

Introduction

PHDO remains committed to fostering humanitarian relief and long-term development in Pakistan's underserved regions. This report underscores our focus on "softer" initiatives, emphasizing community empowerment, inclusion, and resilience-building. During 2023-2024, we engaged over 1,200 beneficiaries through collaborative efforts with local partners, addressing social barriers and promoting equitable access to resources. Our programs prioritized vulnerable groups, including women, men, persons with disabilities (PWDs), and youth, amid ongoing challenges like natural disasters and economic instability.



Program and Achievements:

Below is a summary of key activities and outcomes, presented in a tabular format for clarity:

NADRA Registration Facilitation	Assisted individuals in securing national identity registrations to enable access to government services and rights.	550 total registrations completed (Women 180, Men 120, PWDs)	Improved civic participation; 550 total registrations completed, leading to better enrollment in welfare programs.
Climate Change Adaptation Awareness Sessions	Delivered educational workshops on adaptive strategies, including sustainable farming and water conservation.	700 Community Members (across 20 sessions)	Enhanced local knowledge; participants reported 35% better preparedness for environmental risks.

These efforts have cultivated stronger community bonds and self-sufficiency, with surveys revealing heightened awareness and participation in local governance. Challenges such as remote access and resource limitations were mitigated through volunteer networks
