Annual Progress Report 2024-2025

Executive Summary

PHDO, a leading NGO dedicated to humanitarian aid and sustainable development in Pakistan, continued its mission to empower vulnerable communities through inclusive, community-driven initiatives. This report highlights our programmatic efforts, focusing on facilitation, awareness, mobilization, and capacity building. Over the past year, we reached over 1,500 individuals across marginalized groups, fostering resilience and social inclusion amid challenges like disasters and economic inequities. Our work emphasized collaboration with local stakeholders to achieve lasting impact.

Key Achievements

- **Facilitation of NADRA Registrations:** PHDO supported 300 women, 200 men, and 150 persons with disabilities (PWDs) in obtaining NADRA registrations. This initiative enhanced access to essential services, including social protection schemes, voting rights, and identity documentation, empowering participants to engage more fully in civic and economic activities.
- **Awareness Sessions on Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR):** Conducted 25 interactive sessions across rural and urban areas, reaching 800 community members. These sessions educated participants on preparedness, early warning systems, and mitigation strategies, reducing vulnerability to floods and earthquakes prevalent in Pakistan. Feedback indicated a 40% increase in community-reported readiness levels.



- **Facilitation of Social Welfare Department Registrations for PWDs:** Assisted 450 PWDs in registering with the Social Welfare Department, unlocking benefits such as disability allowances, assistive devices, and vocational training opportunities. This effort promoted inclusivity and advocated for PWD rights at local government levels.

- **Community Mobilization for Resource Distribution:** PHDO teams mobilized community-based organizations (CBOs) in 15 villages, resulting in landowners voluntarily collecting and donating 600 Maunds (approximately 24,000 kg) of wheat. This was distributed to 300 vulnerable families, addressing food insecurity and strengthening communal solidarity during

harvest shortages.

- **Women's Empowerment Workshops:** Organized 15 workshops for 400 women, focusing on leadership skills, financial literacy, and gender rights. Participants formed self-help groups, leading to micro-initiatives like home-based enterprises, enhancing household incomes by an average of 20%.

Looking Ahead
